# TRIANGULAR SHAWL to Crochet <br> Design courtesy of Lion Brand ${ }^{\ominus}$ Yarn Company. 

A combination of half-double crochet stitches and chain spaces create the lacy fabric in this triangular shawl. The charming scallop edging adds the perfect finishing touch.

## $\square \square \square$ EASY

Finished Size: 32" x 55" ( $81.5 \times 139.5 \mathrm{~cm}$ ) not including 2" ( 5 cm ) edging

## MATERIALS

Lion Brand ${ }^{\circledR}$ Vanna's Choice (Art. \#860) (e4 4 ) [3.5 ounces, 170 yards (100 grams, 156 meters) per ball]:
\#143 Antique Rose - 4 balls
Lion Brand ${ }^{\circledR}$ crochet hook, size J -10 ( 6 mm ) or size needed for gauge
Lion Brand ${ }^{\circledR}$ split ring marker
Lion Brand ${ }^{\circledR}$ large-eyed blunt needle

GAUGE: 13 (hdc, ch-2 sp) and 22 rows $=10 "$ ( 25.5 cm )
BE SURE TO CHECK YOUR GAUGE.

## SHAWL

Ch 4, hdc in first ch to form ring.
Row 1: Ch 4 (counts as first hdc plus ch 2), turn; hdc in ring, ch 2 , hdc in ring: 2 ch-2 sps.

Row 2: Ch 4, turn; (hdc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2) twice, hdc in 2nd ch of beginning ch-4: 3 ch- 2 sps.

Rows 3-70: Ch 4, turn; (hdc in next ch-2 sp, ch 2) across, hdc in 2 nd ch of beginning ch-4: 71 ch- 2 sps at end of Row 70 .

## EDGING

Row 1: Ch 1, turn to work along left diagonal side; sc in first sp at side, (ch 3, sc in next sp at side) across left diagonal edge until 70 ch- 3 sps have been made, ch 3 , sc in same sp at tip of Shawl, place marker around ch-3 sp, (ch 3, sc in next sp) 70 times along right diagonal edge: 141 ch-3 sps.

Row 2: Ch 3, turn; 2 dc in first ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3 , sc in next ch-3 sp, $\dagger 5 \mathrm{dc}$ in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3 , sc in next ch-3 sp $\dagger$; repeat from $\dagger$ to $\dagger$ across to ch-3 sp before marked ch-3 sp, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, 5 dc in marked ch-3 sp at tip of Shawl, 3 dc in next ch-3 sp, sc in next ch-3 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch- 3 sp ; repeat from $\dagger$ to $\dagger$ across to last ch-3 sp, 2 dc in last ch-3 sp, dc in last sc.

Row 3: Ch 4, turn; skip first dc, dc in next dc, ch 1 , dc in next dc, $\dagger \star$ skip next sc, sc in next ch-3 sp, skip next sc, dc in next dc, (ch 1, dc in next dc) 4 times; repeat from $\star 21$ times more, skip next sc, sc in next ch-3 sp, skip next sc $\dagger$, dc in next dc, (ch 1, dc in next dc) 10 times; repeat from $\dagger$ to $\dagger$ once, ( dc in next dc , ch 1) twice, dc in 3 rd ch of beginning ch-3.

Row 4: Ch 1, turn; sc in first ch-1 sp, ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp, $\dagger \star$ skip next dc, sc in next sc , sc in next ch-1 sp, (ch 3 , sc in next ch-1 sp) 3 times; repeat from $\star 21$ times more, skip next dc, sc in next sc, sc in next ch-1 sp $\dagger$, (ch 3, sc in next ch-1 sp) 9 times; repeat from $\dagger$ to $\dagger$ once, ch 3 , sc in top of beginning ch- 4 , slip st in 3rd ch of beginning ch-4; finish off.

Weave in yarn ends.
